It's Good to be Green

We begin every day Green.

Green is the expected behaviour of all children in our school

We will be rewarded with, praise, dojos, class treats and 'Good to be Green' half term events.

Staying Green helps everybody keep safe, be happy and be able to learn to the best of their ability.

Teachers, parents and our peers are very proud of our Green Children.

We are proud of ourselves to stay Green.

First Verbal Warning

If we display a low level behaviour. The teacher will say:

"This is your first verbal warning."

Explain the behaviour which needs to change.

Amber Behaviours

If we continue to display incidents of low level behaviour. The teacher will say:

'You have had a verbal warning, but are continuing to..... You are now receiving an Amber card.'

We receive an Amber card

3 points are deducted from Class Dojo

Forgiveness is at the heart of our behaviour system. We are provided with chances to put things right once we accept the consequence of our actions.

If we display an improved behaviour and attitude to learning.

If we are consistently showing green behaviours.

We re-join the class with a clear explanation of our expected behaviours.

Our work is completed to an acceptable standard.

Sincere apologies are made.

Situation is resolved.

Red Behaviours

If we continue to display low level behaviour with no improvements.

Or

We display medium level behaviour.

We receive a Red card.

Our behaviour is logged by the teacher.

We will complete a **"Reconciliation"** at lunch time

On some occasions, we may have to work in another class for 20 minutes to continue our work.

5 points are deducted from Class Dojo

High Level Behaviours

If we display high level behaviours this is taken very serious.

Our Deputy Headteacher/ Pastoral Manager or a member of SLT need to be informed about Straight Red Behaviours.

As a consequence, we will have an internal exclusion to another class/group room for half day or day.

Our behaviour is logged by the teacher.

We will also complete a **"Reconciliation"** at lunch time

A decision is to be made whether our behaviour is severe enough to be referred to our Headteacher.

Our parents are to be called into school for an important meeting.

Lunchtime, internal and external exclusions are to be made on our Headteacher's direction and Governors will be informed.
