Our school commitment

Aims

At St Antony's RC Primary School, we want equality for all. This is not simply ensuring that everyone has the same opportunities; it is providing equity through resources and experiences so that children's different requirements are accommodated. In this way, children can then be treated equally. Many of our families live in social and economic disadvantage. Pupils come to school dealing with family crises, SEMH issues, medical needs, hunger, poverty and language barriers. We must deal with all of these needs to provide equity so that pupils can then be treated equally. Examples of how we do this include:

to provide a modern, inclusive curriculum which reflects Gospel values

- providing free breakfast, grab bags and food parcels so hunger is not a barrier to learning
- all staff are trained to recognise trauma and be ACE aware so that strategies can be put in place to get each child in a good state of being ready to learn
- train specialist staff to support children with gender or gender identity needs
- recruiting staff who represent our community
- recruiting staff who are strong role models from a variety of backgrounds and characteristics
- making financial choices which put removal of barriers as a priority
- using adaptive teaching and support staff in a fluid way to support different children at times of need
- being individually focused to remove individual barriers for a child
- building close, trusting relationships with families to help remove barriers
- ensuring strong pastoral support is in place for all, pupils and staff, to provide the best teaching and learning environment
- making sure that our school is a safe and secure place for everyone
- make sure that no-one experiences less favourable treatment or discrimination because of:
 - ✓ age
 - √ disability
 - ✓ ethnicity, colour or national origin
 - ✓ gender
 - ✓ gender identity (they have reassigned or plan to reassign their gender)
 - ✓ marital or civil partnership status
 - √ being pregnant or having recently had a baby
 - ✓ religion or belief
 - ✓ sexual identity and orientation.

We aim to make sure that people from different groups are consulted and are involved in our decisions, especially pupils, parents and those of us who can be treated less favourably.

We want all stakeholders to attain more highly, have better health, be socially skilled, be financially sufficient, be more aspirational for themselves and their children and live a longer, happier life.

Our objectives for 2023-2025 are:

We want all pupils, staff and parents to feel comfortable, safe and valued in school; we will do this by:

- Prioritising the emotional wellbeing of pupils, staff and families
- To ensure resources are representative of all stakeholders in our community
- Prioritising good communication and oracy so that every person feels heard and valued; pupils and staff have the confidence to speak their truth and stand up for what is right.
