

Key facts to remember

1. A coastline is where the land meets the sea. The United Kingdom has an expansive coastline, surrounded by the Atlantic Ocean, English Channel, Irish Sea and North Sea.
2. The four cardinal compass points are North, East, South and West.
3. A map symbol has a specific meaning and are often drawn to look like what it represents.
4. Physical features of the coastline are caves, bays, beaches, cliffs and sand dunes. Human features of the coastline include lighthouses, lifeboat stations, harbours, piers, shops and hotels.
5. It is important to protect our seas and oceans and there are a range of ways we can take action.

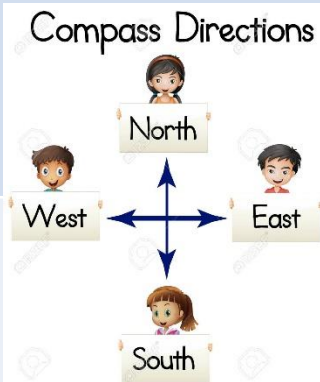
Vocabulary

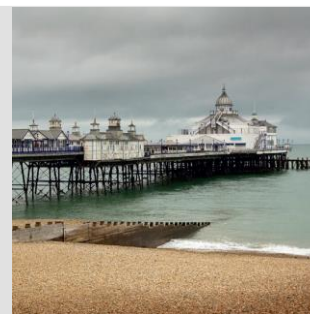
