Key facts to remember

1. The seven continents of the world are North America, South America, Europe, Africa, Australia, Asia and Antarctica.
2. The North Pole is the most northern point on Earth. The South Pole is the most southern point on Earth.
3. The equator is an imaginary line that divides the world into the Northern and Southern Hemispheres.
4. Countries located on or near the equator are hotter than countries further away from the equator.
5. The physical and human features will be different in a hot and cold place.

Vocabulary

Continent	a large solid area of land on earth
Climate	weather of a specific region over a long period of time.
Savannah	flat grasslands with scattered trees and shrubs
Vegetation	plants or plant life in a particular place
Temperate	no extreme hot or cold weather.
Arid	extremely dry, especially from lack of rainfall
